HOLY TRINITY HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT ACTIVITIES

STUDENT COUNCIL

The Student Council of Holy Trinity High School is organized by constitution for the purpose of representing the student body, providing student oriented extra-curricular activities and promoting school spirit. Student Council organizes and supervises social events, performs charitable works and strives to develop learning excellence within our Catholic context.

STUDENT ACTIVITY FEE

In February of each year, at the time of course selection, a student activity fee will be collected from each student. All students must have a Student Activity Card. The card will enable students to join teams and clubs and borrow resource materials from the Learning Resource Centre. The Activity Fee will also help to support the Athletic programs at the school both Intramural and League. There are 2 packages for the Student Activity Fee: Package A is \$70.00 and includes a Yearbook, an Agenda Book and the Student Activity Card/Library Card; Package B is \$45.00 and contains the Student Agenda Book and the Student Activity Card/Library Card.

SCHOOL LETTER

This award is given to a student in recognition of academic achievement and participation in athletic and/or community activities while in attendance at Holy Trinity High School. To qualify for a School Letter a student must accumulate a total of 120 points throughout their secondary school career. A minimum of 30 points must be attained in 2 of the 3 categories: Academic, Athletics or Co-curricular and

Catholic Community Contribution. A point system has been developed for all aspects of school activities. This Letter is given out annually at graduation.

YEARBOOK

The Yearbook is a prized and cherished souvenir of life at Holy Trinity. Many students and staff are involved in the creation of the yearbook. If you have interests in journalism, layout, design or photography come and get involved and sign up for the course (IDC4UY) or volunteer as a photographer. Senior students can also apply to be the editor of the yearbook.

TRINITY CALLING

Our school newspaper, inspired by the late teacher Matt Wilson, provides an opportunity for all students in the school to publish their work, both written and visual. Senior students can apply to be the editor of the school paper; they are assisted by the Communications Technology program and the Yearbook course. All students are invited to take part as journalists, photographers and layout artists.

HTN NEWS

The Communications Technology program produces a weekly school video news show. Students and staff throughout the school are invited to be on camera to contribute stories and events.

TIGER ATHLETIC COUNCIL

Holy Trinity teams are called The Tigers. They wear the school colours of black, yellow and white. Our school teams have captured many championships and the banners in our gym proudly display this

fact. Our success in athletics is because of the excellent athletes who attend Holy Trinity and the fine teaching staff who spend many volunteer hours coaching.

The purpose of the Tiger Athletic Council is to promote athletics within the school community and to create and boost school spirit.

PEER MINISTRY

One of the best ways to be involved in school life at Holy Trinity, is to be a member of the peer ministry team.
